Dear Parents,

Our first job at school is to make sure your child is safe whilst s/he is with us. There are very obvious precautions we take such as locking the gates that open onto Laurel Road during the school day or making sure that we have up to date information should we need to contact you in an emergency **(please let us know about a change of address, change of work, home or mobile number).**

There are also other things we do that might be less obvious. For instance, all staff received updated information about safeguarding at one of the INSET Days before the children started back this year. Another example of how we keep your child safe is happening this week when we have a fire alarm test. We always tell the children about the first one of the year and we go through which way to leave the building and where we should meet. The other tests are not announced but, because the children have been trained about what to do when their hear the fire alarm, they can evacuate the building sensibly and quickly.

Let's hope for dry weather on Wednesday when the test takes place!
